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Ephphatha- Be opened!

“Ephphatha – be opened,’ sums up Christ’s entire mission...He became man so that man, made inwardly deaf and dumb by sin, would become able to hear the voice of God, the voice of love speaking to his heart, and learn to speak in the language of love, to communicate with God and with others” (Pope Emeritus, Benedict XVI).

It is a great opportunity to gather to celebrate the Eucharist through which we encounter Jesus in Word and Sacrament. The words from the readings, prayers, and songs are meant to invite us to reflect on how they touch and challenge us. The first reading, the prophecy of Isaiah, the prophecy of hope was given to his people in the face of their fears. These words are very relatable to us because our life will never be devoid of fear and worries. Every day has its own trouble and brings new challenges to us that can be depressive and even make us anxious about what the future will be.

As St. Paul admonished us in the second reading, “Listen my beloved brothers and sisters”, God wants us to continue to listen to different ways he speaks to us. He wants us to be instruments through which others receive these words of hope and consolation. Very striking in the gospel is this word “*Ephphatha*” “*Be opened*” which is one of the rites we perform during the baptism of a child and through which we ask God to open the ears and mouth of the child to be opened to hear the word of God and to speak out the faith in Christ. We all share in this gift of “*Be opened*” through our baptism and God wants us to keep it living and active.

Thus, the invitation to reflect on what we hear and speak; being mindful that words can lift up, but also they can destroy. We ask ourselves, do the words we hear bring us hope and encouragement or despair and fear? Also, do the words that come from our mouth uplift or demoralize, encourage or discourage, build or destroy others? Let us ask the good Lord that the words we hear can bring us hope and strength and that we become sources of hope and consolation to others by the words that come from us. Amen.

“Let the words of my mouth be acceptable, the thoughts of my heart before you, LORD, my rock and my redeemer” (Psalm 19:15)


