"The hope in the Resurrection does not disappoint. In fact, it is Jesus Himself who first took this journey; we walk along the path He has trod. With His Cross, Jesus has opened the gate of salvation, where we will contemplate God."

(Pope Francis' homily on All Souls Day 11/02/16)

God has given us the will power to accept or reject the gift of salvation he has given us in Christ. He patiently calls on us through different opportunities of our lives to accept and embrace this gift with its challenges. God wants us to continuously say yes to this through our perseverance. The challenges of perseverance come in the face of difficulty and disappointments of life, but that is when we have the true test of our faith in God, who will not fail us if we trust in him. Let us continue to pray for the gifts of wisdom and courage we need to continue to persevere in the Lord. Amen.
